

ARGENTINIAN RAINFOREST

Sadly the Argentinian rainforest suffers from deforestation. Currently the rainforest has 2.85 million square meters, but 25 years ago there was 3.42 million square meters. Meaning that over the last 25 years we have reduced the dense tree habitation by 16 %. Another example is that the Argentinian rainforest covered 9 % of the world 50 years ago, today it only cover 5.5 %, which means that over the last 50 years we have almost halved the Argentinian rainforest.

Unfortunately this is not just t	he case in Argentina, but all ov	er the world, including places lik	ke Asia, Europe, and especially Brazil.

So why are selfish companies destroying the lungs of our earth?

- Farming- the rainforest is in a great place to grow food and vegetables this is mainly because of where it is situated.
 The rainforest is located near the equator which puts it in the tropical zone, making the climate warm, wet and humid. It is the perfect place to grow certain crops.
- 2) Space-As the rainforest is so large and densely populated with habitation, there is not a lot of space for local people to live in. The rainforest currently only holds 9 million people, which is not a lot for 2.8 million square meters of land.
- 3) Palm oil- about 1 football field is being cut down a minute for palm oil in the Argentinian rainforest. What is palm oil? Palm oil is an oil made from vegetables and palm.

Palm is produced from trees, and the best way to obtain it is by cutting trees. What do we use palm oil for?

Well, surprisingly it is in most of the daily products we use, such as soap, laundry detergent, dish soap, processed food, baked goods,

instant noodles, muesli bars, biscuits, butter, bread, shampoo, lipstick and many more.

So now that you realise how many different product we use that contain palm oil, what can we do to help stop deforestation? You can use palm oil free products like palm oil free lipstick and soap. Doing these little thing can have a big impact, so make sure you put the small amount of effort into saving the lungs of our world.

How does deforestation damage us? You might not realise what is happening, but the people and animals that live are being seriously impacted.

They are inhaling smoke constantly, and we are destroying all of the animals habitats such as monkey, apes and millions more.




Madagascar has sadly decreased by 6.97 percent in forest population from 1995 to 2020.

The percentage change from 1995 and 2020 is 2.26%

Did you know Slovenia is home to the highest spruce tree in Europe. Its over 62 meters high!

How I worked it out?

12,378.3-12,105 x 100 = 2.26% 12,105

Slovenia is the third most forested country in Europe, covering 58% of the country.

In 1995 the total land covered by forests in Canada was 3,480,374.5 (sq km) opposed to 2020 it was 3,469,281 (sq km) That means there has been a -0.32 Now you may be wondering why it has decreased and so keep reading to find out...

Why is deforestation happening in Canada?



- Industrial agriculture About 5 million hectors are destroyed because of Industrial agriculture each year.
- Oil and gas drilling and mining Oil and gas drilling and mining exploits the boreal.
- Logging Each year, industrial logging operations clearcut approximately one million acres of intact forest, equivalent to five NHL hockey rink–size areas every minute.

What are the consequences of deforestation in Canada?
