

# Outdoor Activities & Language

The Outdoor Activities and Language Camps are open to children aged between 10 and 15 from around the world.

The programmes will combine language instruction, in either English or German, with Austrian culture and outdoor adventure.

We accept all language abilities, from beginners to advanced intermediate, and are pleased to be able to offer this language learning in one of the most beautiful locations in Austria.

## **Daily Programme**

#### I FARN IN THE MORNINGS AND CHALLENGE YOURSELF IN THE AFTERNOONS

#### Language - English or German

Summer Camp participants will attend 3 hours of classes per day for a total of 15 hours of instruction per week of focused language tuition in either English or German.

Learning is designed and delivered at each student's particular level and within a fun and active classroom environment. Learning a new language will open a window to intercultural understanding and help develop critical thinking skills. Students will also have the opportunity to apply their learned language to real world situations. This is a truly fun way to explore language learning and Austria at the same time.

The language lessons will be delivered by highly skilled instructors, with an emphasis on communication and conversational skills. Thereby we offer English and German lessons from beginner (A1 and A2 level) to intermediate (B1 and B2 level).

#### **Outdoor Activities**

Our backyard is one of the most beautiful natural sports arenas in the world! Students will have the opportunity to explore water sports, mountain sports and rock sports in the Salzkammergut region.

Amongst the opportunities available are hiking across the mountains, rock climbing with spectacular views, paddle boarding and kayaking on the crystal blue lake, biking, swimming, high ropes, cliff jumping and more.

#### **Cultural Activities**

St. Gilgen has a rich cultural heritage. Mozart's mother and sister both lived here; Gustav Klimt painted in the Attersee region; and Marie von Ebner-Eschenbach had her summer residence in St. Gilgen and wrote extensively here. The cultural activities focus on touring the region to become fully immersed in the history and surroundings.

Salzburg is just a short trip away, as are attractions such as the salt mines and ice caves of the Dachstein.

## Camp I, II, III Schedule

4th - 17th JULY | 18TH - 31ST JULY | 2ND - 15TH AUGUST

Students arrive between 10am and 11am on the first day of camp and begin activities straight after lunch. Departure is normally between 17:00 and 18:00 on the last day of camp as there is a jam-packed camp program all the way until 17:00.

In the afternoons, campers are divided into small activity groups of up to 8 students, organized by age. Our goal is to ensure every group experiences all activities at least once during the first week of camp. Towards the end of camp, we introduce optional activity days, giving participants the opportunity to

revisit their favourite activities—sometimes at a more advanced level.

Thursdays are "Choice Days," where campers can select from horse trekking, sailing/windsurfing, an archery course, or MTB skills/cycling, and more.

Please note: the programme may vary depending on weather conditions or group dynamics. Below you can find an example of the daily programme (Please note: Arrival date for Camp III is on Sunday).

# Focused Sailing Activity

4<sup>TH</sup> - 17<sup>TH</sup> JULY

Whether a beginner or advanced, campers will have the opportunity to learn the theory of sailing and further develop their sailing skills on the idyllic Mondsee Lake for six afternoons, 3.5 hours per afternoon, over the course of two weeks.

Campers will learn the basic knots, wind directions, how to sail in strong winds, what to do in light winds and how to prepare the boat for sailing. Campers conclude the camp with the Grundschein Exam, after the exam they



will be able to sail the boat by themselves and instruct their co-sailors. The Grundschein is a basic sailing license whichs allows the students to rent sailing boats up to 14sqm on any lake worldwide. Advanced sailers can have the opportunity to study and train for the BFA Binnen exam.

When not on the water sailing, the campers join in with the rest of the outdoor activity/ camp programme.

improve. They can even have the possibility of gaining their Platzreife (subject to interest).


When not on the Golf course, the campers join in with the rest of the outdoor activity programme.

This camp invites students to explore how sound can be transformed into music using natural elements, electronic devices, and cutting-edge digital tools. Participants will work with industry-standard software, gaining practical experience in sampling, beat-making, remixing, and sound design.

How to capture and manipulate sounds from the local environment; Techniques for creating original beats and remixes; Fundamentals of digital audio workstations (DAWs) - Logic Pro X/Ableton; Sound design principles used in modern music production

Open to beginners and aspiring producers alike, this camp is ideal for students with a passion for music and creativity. Whether you're just starting out or already experimenting at home, you'll find inspiration, guidance, and a vibrant community of fellow creators.

# Focused Horseriding Activity

2<sup>ND</sup> - 15<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST

Whether a beginner or advanced rider, campers will learn and develop their riding skills during the 10 afternoons horse riding on camp. St Gilgen International School and Summer Camp work in partnership with EWOT Academy to provide the ultimate equestrian experience expertly led by award winning young competition riders.

The sessions are tailored to each riders needs through fun, goal setting and video analysis. Beginners start with one-on-one



lounge lessons whilst experienced riders can work on their dressage, gymnastics and jumping. When not on a horse riders will learn how to care for them and prepare them for riding.

Riders can have the option to work towards their riding badges during the camp and then be examined on the last days of camp.

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## **Arrivals & Departures**

#### **FVFRYTHING FOR A SMOOTH CAMP START AND FINISH**

#### With parents/ friends/family

Parents are welcome to bring their children to our camp themselves and get a feel for the village, school and its surroundings. Campers should aim to arrive in St Gilgen between 10 - 11am on arrival day and collect their children between 17:00- 19:00 on departure day. If it is not possible for you to arrive or depart during these times, please contact our office in advance. The exact arrival address will be emailed out in the welcome email a few weeks before the start of the camp.

#### Salzburg Train Station

If you are happy for your child to travel alone, or with a friend, we will be happy to pick them up directly at the train platform in Salzburg. We do not charge any extra fee for the pick-up service. Tickets for the train ride need to be organized independently.

The collection service from / to the train platform must be booked at least a month in advance! Please note that the transfer from Salzburg leaves at approximately 11:30, so the arrival should ideally be between 10:00 and 11:30. For return trips, the train should not leave before 18:00 and not after 19:00.

We regret that should the train be significantly delayed, extra costs for an individual transfer to the camp may be incurred.


#### Salzburg Airport

On the day of arrival your child will be met in the arrival hall by a member of the camp team and taken care of from this point. On departure day, children are taken to the airport and escorted to security.

Please note that we only guarantee collection before 12pm on arrival day and drop off after 13:00 on departure day. Outside of these times collection/ drop off may not be possible, or incur an additional charge, please contact us asap and we will endeavour to help you.

#### **Munich Airport**

On the day of arrival your child will be met in the arrival hall by a member of the camp team and taken care of from this point. All arrivals need to be between 10.30am - 15:00. On departure day children are taken to the airport and escorted to security. The return times to the airport are 12:00 – 19:00, so flights would need to depart between 15:00 and 19:00.



There is an additional cost for this service of 250 EUR one way and 400EUR roundtrip per person.

#### For airport departures only

If your airline requires you to book an Unaccompanied Minor Service for your child, please note that a €50 surcharge applies. This fee covers the cost of assigning a dedicated member of our staff to remain at the airport with your child until their flight has safely departed, adding to your piece of mind.

Airport collections must be **booked at least**1 month in advance.

For all flights – parents are responsible for ensuring that all paperwork or unaccompanied minor services are correctly booked and paid for, the camp can only offer a pick up/drop off service and cannot accept responsibility for flights missed due to incorrect paperwork or outstanding fees at the airport.

# Boarding and Pastoral Care

#### A HOME FROM HOME

All Summer Campers will stay in one of our Boarding Houses. Houseparents and other boarding staff oversee the pastoral needs of the children in their care. We are a small camp with a maximum of 40 participants allowing staff and campers to really get to know each other and campers to feel cared for. Our caring, supportive, friendly environment helps campers to form lasting friendships that bring them back year after year.

#### Our charming student accommodation

St. Gilgen International School has three lovely boarding houses, which are former village hotels, each near the centre of the village. Our boarding houses are for all ages, thereby creating a family atmosphere and

a genuine home from home. All student bedrooms are en-suite equipped.

Boys and girls live on separate floors in the boarding house and each child shares a room with one other child of the same gender.

#### **Health and nutrition**

Summer Camp students enjoy a range of healthy menu options in our unique catering environment using excellent local restaurants and caterers. We serve Austrian cuisine as well as a range of international dishes, and all our meals are made from fresh local ingredients. Salads, vegetables and fruit are freely available.

#### **Conditions of acceptance**

To make a booking you need to submit a completed application form and transfer the 500 Euro non-refundable, non-transferrable deposit immediately, with the full amount required at least one month before the start of the camps.

A confirmation email will be sent of the deposit being received, and another email with joining/arrival instructions including a packing list a few weeks before the start of the camp.

#### Fees include

Accommodation, linen and towels, all meals, language teaching, course materials, all excursions, sports, activities, entertainment and travel from and to Salzburg airport/train station on the arrival and departure days for campers travelling alone.

#### **Programme expectations**

In line with our St. Gilgen International School ethos we have high expectations of our Summer Camp students and in return Summer Camp participants experience excellence.

- Summer Camp participants should always act as Summer Camp ambassadors, with their behaviour reflecting this role.
- Summer Camp participants are expected to show tolerance and respect at all times.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

"WE WELCOME ALL LEVELS OF ABILITY, FROM BEGINNER TO BILINGUAL."

#### 1. Where will my child sleep?

In our boarding houses. Houseparents live in the same accommodation and are on hand 24 hours a day. Boys and girls reside on separate floors of the boarding house.

#### 2. Is there a laundry service?

Students have full access to washing machines and staff are available to assist. However there are a limited number of washing machines, so where possible we encourage students to bring enough clothes for the 2 weeks

#### 3. What should my child bring?

A few weeks before the start of the camp, and once full payment has been received you will receive an email containing joining instructions from the Camp Coordinator. This will contain a packing list, pocket money guidance and suggestions of what your child should and should not bring, as well as any other information you may need to know.

#### 4. What happens outside class?

Children benefit from fully structured days from wake-up to lights out. Our experience shows that campers and parents prefer this schedule. Each day includes some free time so those who wish can spend quiet time in the house, call home, catch up with friends, or go in small groups to buy snacks in the village.

## 5. What is the camp's mobile phone and electronics policy?

While we allow campers to bring mobile phones to contact family, we have a strict usage policy to encourage social interactions and engagement in the outdoor activities. Phones are collected nightly at 21:30 and returned the next day after dinner around 19:00. If your child wishes to contact you outside these hours, they can do so from our office under staff supervision. Though this may seem daunting, we've found that limited phone access helps children engage better with the camp and each other, creating lasting memories.

## 6. How can I communicate with my child?

Before the start of the camp you will be emailed a contact number for the Summer Camp boarding team where you will always be able to reach a member of the house team who will be able to assist you if you need to urgently contact your child. However, due to the busy nature of the camp, the best time to reach your children is from 21:00-21:30 every day.

## 7. Will my child require health or travel insurance?

Yes. All campers must have either a valid EU Health Insurance Card or private health/travel insurance. Please note that the camp cannot cover costs for medications, doctor visits, or hospital care required due to illness or injury.

#### 8. Will my child require a visa?

The responsibility for all visa arrangements (where required) rests solely with the parents of the child. We will provide supporting visa paperwork where necessary.

#### 9. Are all the activities safe?

We have qualified and professional instructors and teachers for all activities who are local and familiar with the area. Details of risk assessments for activities can be shared with parents upon request.

#### 10. Will my child always be supervised?

The village of St. Gilgen is extremely safe, so we allow campers limited unsupervised free time in small groups to buy snacks or souvenirs. They must inform us when and where they're going, who they're with, and their expected return time so we always know their whereabouts. During trips to Bayern Park and a shopping mall, campers must stay within set boundaries, remain in groups of three or more with a working phone and staff contact numbers saved. Regular check-in times with staff are established.

#### **Our school**

St. Gilgen International School is a coeducational boarding and day school for children between the ages of 9 and 18. The language of instruction is English.

#### International education


#### Our village campus


